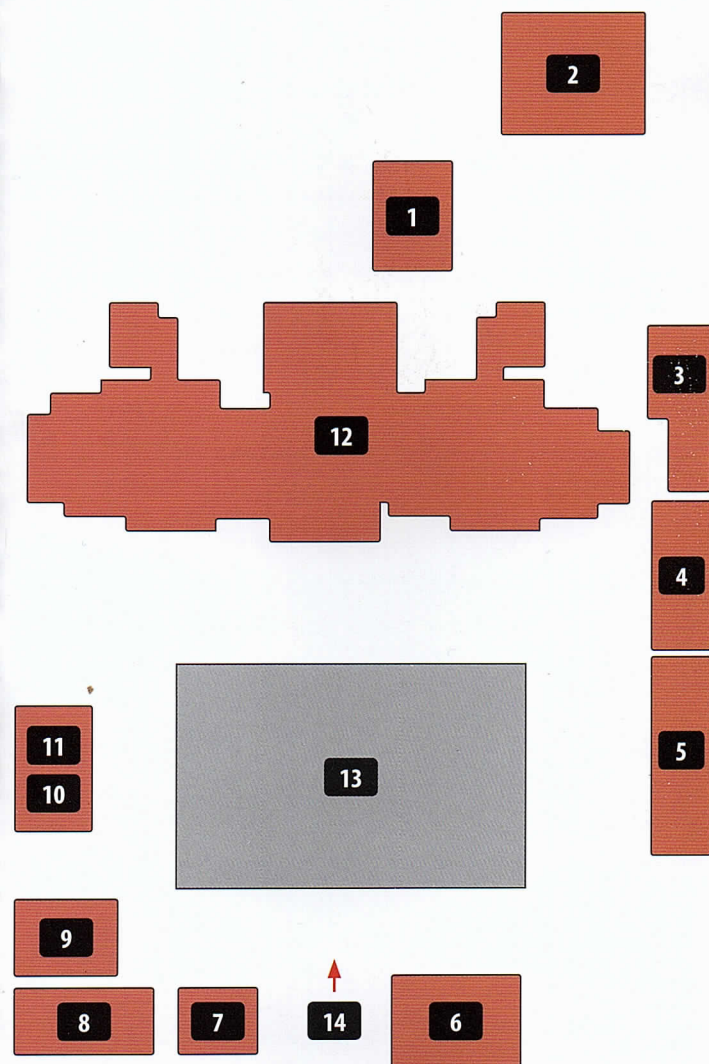


Aerial View Map



- 1** Built in 1927 as the Regimental Aid Post, later an Officers' and Cadet officers' Mess, now volunteer lunch room.
- 2** Meeting room, built in 1913-14 as a hospital, became a Sergeants' Mess in 1927, later a combined mess.
- 3** Built in 1911 as a transport section containing a horse and cart shed, northern extension added in 1939 for a garage and workshop, now a store.
- 4** Built in 1939 as a maintenance section and offices. Later a technical store, now displays museum exhibits with Army Museum Foundation occupying adjoining offices.
- 5** Museum administration. Built in 1911 as Quartermaster's store. In 1919 became a treatment centre for malaria patients. Later a HQ for the Cadet Brigade.
- 6** Curatorial offices, built in 1911 as the orderly room and Master Gunner's office.
- 7** Built in 1911 as a guard room and included two lock-up cells used until late 1940's, now front gate use.
- 8** Built in 1940 as an army signals/communications centre, now curatorial store.
- 9** Built in 1930's as a canteen, later a stores depot, now a store.
- 10** Built in 1910 as the gymnasium, now a store.
- 11** Museum workshop, built in 1939 as an anti-aircraft artillery park.
- 12** Main Artillery Barracks building. East wing built in 1910, west wing in 1913 and centre link unit added in 1930's. Now houses the display galleries, lecture/conference room, archives and museum gift shop.
- 13** Barracks parade ground, now the car park.
- 14** Entrance to museum.
